n one of the worst air tragedies, an Air India Boeing 787-8 Dreamliner (VT-ÄNB), Ahmedabad to London airport, crashed shortly into a residential area near the Ahmedabad airport minutes after take-off at 1.38 pm on Thursday afternoon, with 242 people on board, including two pilots and 10 cabin crew members. One person has miraculously survived, while 241 of his

BJP's Vijay Rupani (68) a former Chief Minister of Gujarat (from 2016 to 2021) was among passengers killed in the crash. Of them, 169 Indians, 53 British nationals, seven Portuguese and one Canadian national were on board.

co-passengers are feared dead.

The plane was headed to London Gatwick airport in the UK, Air India said, when it crashed in a civilian area near the airport. Shortly after takeoff, the Air Traffic Control (ATC) received a MAYDAY call. However, the ATC said that it received no response even after repeated attempts were made to get in touch. A MAY-DAY call is given in cases of extreme emergency when the aircraft faces immediate danger.

"As per ATC, aircraft departed from Ahmadabad at 1339 IST (0809 UTC) from runway 23. It gave a MAYDAY Call to ATC, but thereafter no response was given by the aircraft to the calls made by ATC. Immediately after departure from Runway 23, fell on ground outside the airport perimeter. Heavy black smoke was seen coming from the accident site, the DGCA said in a statement.

The aircraft entered a slow descent shortly after taking off, with its landing gear still extended before exploding into a huge fireball upon impact. The crash took place in a residential area, which could mean a higher death toll. The twinengine plane had reached an altitude of 625 feet or 190.5 metres at a speed of 174 knots, according to data from Flightradar24.

As the plane plunged at a rate of 475 feet per minute from 625 feet, the pilots had less than a minute to react before it eventually crashed and exploded near the Ahmedabad airport upon impact with a building in a residential area.

The plane slammed into a hostel for doctors of BJ Medical College in Ahmedabad's Meghaninagar area killing five students, sparking a massive fire and widespread panic in the locality. Visuals from the crash site show debris had pierced through the wall of a dining hall of the hostel, with food still visible on some of the plates. Visuals showed charred wreckage of the plane, thick smoke rising from the site and emergency personnel at work. Some videos also showed injured taken to hospitals.

The plane was under the command of Captain Sumeet Sabharwal along with First Officer Clive Kundar, with a combined flying experience of 9,300 hours while Captain Sabharwal had 8,200 hours of flying experience; his co-pilot had 1,100 hours under his belt. Survivor recounts 30 seconds

n a tragic plane crash accident where no one was Lexpected to survive, one man did. Vishwash Kumar Ramesh, a 40-year-old British national, emerged as the sole known survivor of the Air India flight AI-171 that crashed in Ahmedabad on Thursday afternoon, minutes after take-off.

Currently admitted at the Civil Hospital in Asarwa, Vishwash is being treated for multiple injuries to his chest, eyes and feet. Lying on a hospital bed, he recounted the terrifying moment the Boeing 787 Dreamliner went down. "Thirty seconds after takeoff, there was a loud noise and then the plane crashed. It all happened so quickly," he said, clutching

boarding pass. Vishwash, who has been living in London for the last 20 years, had travelled to India for a short visit with his brother Ajay Kumar Ramesh, 45. The two had recently visited Diu and were heading back to the UK on the same flight. "My brother was sitting in a different row. I haven't been able to find him. Please

help me," he said. Recalling the crash, Vishwash said he lost consciousness for a brief moment. "When I got up, there were bodies all around me. I was scared.

I stood up and ran. There were pieces of the plane scattered everywhere," he said. Someone held me and put me in an ambulance. That's how I reached the hospital."

According to officials, Vishwash was seated in 11A a window seat in the first row of the Economy class cabin, located just ahead of the aircraft's wings. The seat position may have played a role in his survival. A senior police officer confirmed, "The police found one survivor in seat 11A. He was brought to the

hospital and is currently under treatment. The number of casualties is still being verified."

Flight AI-171, with 232 passengers and 10 crew members, was en route to London when it lost altitude shortly after take-off and crashed into the residential quarters of BJ Medical College doctors in Meghaninagar, close to the Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport. Eyewitnesses said the aircraft crashed into five-storey buildings, causing major

damage and fires. So far, authorities have not confirmed the exact number of fatalities, but several residents in the affected buildings were also reportedly injured.

Fire, smoke billows; charred bodies scattered

¬here was a layer of thick smoke in the air. When we came here, dead bodies and debris from the crashed aircraft were scattered all over." These chilling words from an eyewitness describe the horrifying scene that unfolded in Ahmedabad's Meghaninagar area on Thursday afternoon after an Air India plane bound for London crashed into a residential complex.

The Boeing 787 Dreamliner, Flight AI-171, had taken off from Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport with 242 passengers and crew on board. Minutes later, it lost altitude and slammed into the residential quarters of BJ Medical College doctors, leaving no hope of survival for those onboard and injuring several people on the ground.

What followed was a scene of chaos and disbelief.

"I was at home having lunch when I heard a massive sound. The windows rattled. At first, I thought it was a gas explosion. But when I looked outside, I saw black smoke rising, thick and fast," said Harshit, a medical student living in the quarters. "I rushed out and saw that



stay. My friend who was inside is now in the hospital." According to Haresh Shah, who lives nearby, the aircraft appeared to be flying abnormally low before the crash. 'The plane was descending rapidly. In just seconds, it crashed into the top floors of the doctors' buildings. The impact was so strong that several apartments caught fire.

People started screaming.

Some were stuck inside. It

with smoke and panic. People were running, not knowing what had happened. When I reached the spot, I saw broken wings, burning vehicles and bodies lying around. It was a complete devastation."

Local residents and shopkeepers were among the first to rush to help, even before emergency services arrived. They tried to douse small fires, pulled injured people out of burning flats and used cloth to shield the wounded from smoke.

There were several fivestorey buildings in the compound and many of them caught fire," said Shah. "Cars in the parking lot were burning. People were trying to break open doors and windows to rescue others trapped inside. It was like something from a war zone."

BJP MLA Darshna Vaghela, whose office is close to the crash site, was among the first public officials to reach the scene. "I heard the explosion and ran out immediately. Smoke and fire were everywhere.

Locals were already rescuing people from the debris. Many doctors were injured and taken to nearby hospitals. The scale of destruction is heartbreaking. Rescue teams, including the

fire department, NDRF and medical emergency services, reached shortly after but had to navigate burning debris and unstable structures.

Operations to retrieve remains and assess structural safety of the buildings are still ongoing.

ome Minister Amit Shah said on Thursday that the temperature in the Air India plane that crashed in Ahmedabad was so high due to burning fuel that there was no chance to save anyone. Shah said a detailed inquiry has been ordered.

There was 1.25 lakh litre of fuel inside the plane and it caught heat so it was impossible to save anyone," Shah told reporters. The entire nation is in deep shock following the tragedy, he told reporters. Shah also expressed condolences to relatives of those killed in the accident.

The number of those killed will be officially released by the authorities after DNA test and identification," Shah said. "The process of collecting DNA samples from bodies is over. Forensic Science Laboratory and National Forensic Sciences University in Guiarat will conduct DNA tests," he said.

Experts points bird hit as possible cause

ailure of both engines and a bird hit soon after take-off could be among the probable causes that led to the fatal crash of a Londonbound Air India aircraft with 242 people onboard, according to experts.

Three senior wide-body pilots, who are also instructors, said that looking at the videos of the crash available publicly, it seems that the engines could not gain the required thrust needed for the take-off, resulting in a fatal crash into the residential area seconds after it took off.

The specific reasons for the crash of the Boeing 787-8 aircraft flying from Ahmedabad to London Gatwick will be

known only after the completion of the detailed probe by the Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB). The experts mentioned the possible causes based on the available visuals of the aircraft as it went down.

One of the commanders said it does not seem to be the case of one engine failure because in such a scenario, the aircraft would have been swinging but here, the aircraft was steady.

"So, there is the possibility of both the engines failing. There could have been a loss of thrust in both engines. But these are only possibilities," a commander said, adding that from the images, it appears that either the flaps were up or landing gear was down at the time of

Empowering Rural Women: Mushroom cultivation transforms lives in villages around Adani Power Plant in Godda

the quiet villages of Motia, Dumaria, Patwa, Baksara, and Rangania nestled close to the Adani Power Plant in Godda, something extraordinary is sprouting, not just in the soil, but in the lives of rural women. In just a few seasons. these women, most of whom had no prior experience in farming mushrooms, have turned into skilled cultivators. Encouraged by their success, the groups are now experimenting with paddy straw mushroom, further diversifying their production.

One of the inspiring faces

of this transformation is Priyanka Devi, a resident of Patwa village. Once limited to responsibilities. domestic Privanka now associated with producer farmers Organization (FPO) and a role model in her community.

Vinita, proudly shows the rows of mushroom beds in her small but efficient cultivation shed. Priyanka started with just two bags of oyster mushroom spawn. Today, her group handles over 100 cultivation bags per season and earns consistent income. On average, each member of her group earns between ?2,000 to ?5,000 per month, depending on the yield and season. Impact on Community

The transformation has brought in not only financial stability but also social empowerment. Many of these women are now contributing to their household expenses, sending their children to school, and gaining confidence to speak in village meetings. Encouraged by their success, the Adani Foundation is now exploring market linkages to ensure that these products reach urban markets, thereby improving profitability. This initiative is emerging

as a model of sustainable rural development that combines women empowerment modern agriculture, and grassroots entrepreneurship. The future of AI is already here. In May 2014 Deep Knowledge, a Hong Kong venture capital firm dealing with regenerative medicine, appointed an AI algorithm named VITAL to its board. Like other 5 board members, VITAL gets to vote whether or not the firm invests in a particular company, based on massive amounts of data which it processes

It was earlier thought that the arts were beyond the ken of artificial intelligence. It is not so. David Cook is a musicology professor in the US. He created an AI program named EMI which specialized in composing music in the style of various classical musicians. In one day, EMI composed 5000 chorales in the style of the legend Sebastian Bach. When critics said that the music had no soul, David Cook organized a showdown where there were nine pieces of music, 3 com-

posed by himself, 3 by EMI

and three by the legendary Sebastian Batch. After this a large audience of music buffs were asked to identify which piece was by whom. Amazingly, the audience was not able to differentiate between the music composed

According to officials, the pilot sent a mayday call, and then there was no response after that to repeated calls from the air traffic controller. Visuals from the crash site showed a thick plume of grey smoke rising from the ground. At least two dozen ambulances have arrived, and some have taken the injured people to a nearby hospital. Yellow alert issued as Monsoon advances steadily across Jharkhand

The city is bracing for turbulent weather conditions over the next 72 hours as the Ranchi Meteorological Centre has issued a yellow alert, signalling the intensification of Monsoon activity across Jharkhand. The forecast warns of thunderstorms and lightning accompanied by gusty surface winds reaching speeds of 40–50 kmph, likely to affect isolated parts of the state, including Jamshedpur and surrounding districts.

The alert comes amid the active advancement of the Southwest Monsoon, with weather scientists attributing the unstable atmospheric conditions to multiple cyclonic circulations influencing the region.

According to the latest bulletin from the India Meteorological Department (IMD), an upper air cyclonic circulation has developed over north Chhattisgarh and its adjoining areas, roughly 0.9 km above mean sea level. This system is expected to enhance convective activity, leading to scattered showers and isolated heavy rainfall in eastern Jharkhand. Additionally, another significant cyclonic circulation—initially spotted over the northwest Bay of Bengal—has since moved inland, now hovering over north Odisha and nearby regions. This system is vertically extensive, stretching between 1.5 km and 5.8 km above mean sea level, and is tilting southwards with height-a meteorological signature indicating active monsoon dynamics. In a promising development for

farmers and residents awaiting seasonal rains, the Northern Limit of Monsoon (NLM) has further advanced. As per IMD data, the NLM now runs along the following coordinates: 17.0°N/55°E ? 17.5°N/60°E ? 18°N/65°E ? 18.5°N/70°E ? Mumbai ? Ahilyanagar ? Adilabad ? Bhawanipatna ? Puri ? Sandhead Island? 23.5°N/89.5°E? Balurghat?

This extensive path shows that monsoon winds are gradually pushing northward, and with the current cyclonic circulations aiding moisture convergence, widespread rainfall across Jharkhand seems imminent in the coming days.

The district administration has urged citizens to stay indoors during thunderstorm events, avoid shelter ing under trees, and keep away from electrical appliances. Rural areas and agricultural workers are being advised to exercise caution during early morning and evening hours, which are considered most vulnerable for lightning strikes.

The Jamshedpur Notified Area Committee (JNAC) has reportedly initiated preventive checks on drainage systems to avoid waterlogging in lowlying areas. Municipal workers have been instructed to keep pumps ready and stormwater drains clear in anticipation of heavy downpours.



Ranchi Police have arrested a person, busted a large business of fake notes and recovered 37 fake notes of Rs 500 denomination from him. The police team formed on the instructions of SSP Chandan Kumar Sinha took this action. The name of the arrested person is Subhash Prasad.

The police got this success after an application given by a person named Jamal. Jamal told the police that a boy had come to his mobile shop in Sudha Complex. Who bought a mobile of 3500 rupees and gave seven fake notes of 500 rupees in payment. When Jamal looked at the notes carefully

he came to know that all the notes were fake

and the serial number of many notes was of the same series. He immediately informed the other shopkeepers and questioned the teenag-During the interrogation, Kishore said that his father is kept with Subhash Prasad, at his

house in Kalinagar police station Namkum, more similar fake notes. Based on this infor mation, the police team immediately raided Subhash Prasad's house in Kalinagar. During the search, the police recovered 29

fake notes of 500 value from under the bed of Subhash Prasad, in these notes, many serial numbers were the same, which made it clear that the recovered notes were fake. Police have arrested Subhash Prasad and

detailed inquiries are being done in relation to the fake notes recovered from him. The SSP revealed the whole matter during a press conference in its office on Thursday. The police are now trying to find other members of the network of this fake note and its source.

10 from Rajasthan among victims of crash

t least 10 Rajasthan natives, four from Udaipur and five of a _familv from Banswara district, were among those onboard the Air India flight AI-171 that crashed shortly after takeoff from Ahmedabad airport Thursday afternoon, officials said.

The aircraft, which was headed to London, crashed around 1.40 pm, just two minutes after takeoff, near the airport boundary wall adjacent to the Air Customs Cargo office, sending thick plumes of smoke across the area.

The flight had departed from Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport at 1.38 pm with 242 passengers and crew members onboard.

Among the passengers were Shubh and Shagun Modi, the son and daughter of marble trader Sanjeev Modi from Udaipur. The siblings, both

were travelling to London for leisure, officials said. District Collector Namit

Mehta visited their house in Saheli Nagar to meet the family. "Chief Minister Bhajanlal

Another passenger, Vardichand Menaria, a native of village Rundeda in Vallabhnagar, Udaipur district, a woman from Araba (Balotra)

was also on board. He had recently returned from London and was travelling back along with his associate Prakash Menaria of Rohida village. Both worked in the culinary sector in the UK. Khushboo Rajpurohit,

the passengers on the ill-fated flight. Dr Kaumi Vyas and Dr Pratik Joshi, and their three children, Miraya Joshi, Pradyut Joshi, and Nakul Joshi of Banswara, were in the plane that crashed.

Pradyut and Nakul were twins. Kaumi Vyas, who worked at a private hospital, shared a picture on social media of the family as they sat on the plane - the couple smiling and the three children in the frame behind sitting in another row, facing the camera.

In the wake of the crash, the Rajasthan BJP postponed all its programmes and meetings till further notice.

The ministers were slated to visit all state districts over three days from today and publicise the 11 years' work of the Narendra Modi government. Sharma, who expressed his

grief at the crash deaths, deferred a programme to be held in Banswara on Friday under the Pradhan Mantri

Leader of Opposition Tikaram Jully posted on X, "The news of Air India plane crashing after hitting a wall during takeoff in Ahmedabad is extremely worrying and sad. I pray to God that all the 242 passengers and airline staff on board the plane are completely safe and sound." Former chief minister Ashok

Gehlot, who was attending a public meeting in Pratapgarh when the news broke, cancelled the event. "Thousands who had gathered prayed for the souls of those who lost their lives and the recovery of the injured. We cancelled the ongoing event and all future programmes in Pratapgarh and Banswara," he said.

AI crash: Manipur's Nganthoi still missing

ongbrailatpam Nganthoi Sharma's worst fear came true on Thursday as the London-bound flight on which she was a cabin crew member, crashed in Ahmedabad, even though her family clings to hope as her mobile phone is still switched on and is receiving signals but nobody is responding to their repeated calls.

Twenty-year-old Nganthoi, who was a cabin crew member for the last three years, was among the 242 people onboard Air India Flight AI 171, which crashed minutes after take-off from Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport in Ahmedabad in the afternoon.

Many casualties are feared but the fate of the cabin crew member from Manipur's Thoubal district was not yet known as the authorities did not release a list of fatalities till the filing of this report.

"We called her up several times after receiving the news but nobody picked up the calls. The internet on her phone is also still on. However, we stopped calling her around 6 pm fearing it would drain the battery," K Khenjita, a relative of Nganthoi, said.

A cousin of the cabin crew member said her last message before take-off was, "I'm going to London. In a few minutes, we'll take off. We may not be able to talk for a while."

Wails pierced the air in Awang Leikai in Thoubal as the news of the crash reached the Sharma residence. "We were devastated upon hearing the news... I was very close to her. Today, I can't help but remember what she had said earlier.

She had said she was very scared of plane crash and did not know what she would do in such a scenario," Nganthoi's cousin said.

'Nganthoi was recruited by Air India during a recruitment call in Imphal three years back. She had applied for the job just to try her luck as she was studying an undergraduate course at that time. She got selected and was based in

Mumbai," she added. The family members said they contacted aviation authorities to know about her condition but did not receive any

She said that Nganthoi's mobile phone rang when they

20-year-old Nganthoi, who was a cabin crew member was among the 242 people onboard Air India Flight Al 171, which crashed minutes after take-off from Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel **International Airport in Ahmedabad**

She also expressed frustration over the spread of fake news about her death on social media without any confirmation.

A mother of two, Ranjitha had returned to India from the UK just four days earlier to complete formalities related to her government job, hoping to rejoin service after a stint

She had come home to Pullad, her native village in this south Kerala district, full of hope — to finalise plans for a new house, and to move her children and elderly mother into a safer, more stable life. But what was meant to be a short trip filled with purpose

Ranjitha had taken the first available ticket to return abroad, boarding the flig from Chennai to Ahmedabad. It was a connecting journey back to the UK, where she had been working after a brief period in Salalah, Oman.

Just four days after arriving home, she left again — this time, unknowingly, on her final journey. "She was happy and hopeful when she left," said a close relative. "There were so many plans. So many dreams," he said. Ranjitha had worked as a nurse in

the Kerala government health service but had taken leave to pursue opportunities overseas, hoping to secure a better life for her children — 15-yearold Indhuchoodan, a 10th-standard student, and 12-year-old Etheka,



After her father passed away some years ago, Ranjitha had taken on the full responsibility of raising her children with the help of her mother, Thulassykuttiyamma.

On the day of the crash, Ranjitha was on her way back to the UK to collect her release certificate from the UK hospital and resume work.

But fate struck cruelly. The aircraft crashed shortly after take-off, bursting into flames. The news left the village of Pullad

in mourning. Neighbours, friends and relatives have been visiting the family home in silence, offering condolences that feel too small for the scale of the loss

TIMELINE OF MAJOR AIR CRASHES IN INDIA'S HISTORY

New Delhi: After a London-bound Air India aircraft crashed shortly after taking off from the Ahmedabad airport on Thursday, the spotlight is back on India's history with aviation disasters.

From deadly mid-air collisions and fatal crashes due to poor weather conditions to runway overshoots at tabletop airports, the country has witnessed several tragedies over the decades Here's a list of the most

devastating air accidents in

- India's aviation history: Air India Express Flight 1344 (2020): During the COVID-19 pandemic, Air India Express Flight 1344, operating as part of the ande Bharat repatriation mission, skidded off the runway while landing at the Kozhikode (Calicut) International Airport on August 7, 2020. Amid heavy rainfall, the aircraft overshot the wet tabletop runway, plunged into a valley and split into two. Of the 190 people on board, 21, including two pilots, lost
- Air India Express Flight 812 (2010): Air India Express Flight 812 overshot the runway while landing at the Mangaluru International Airport in Karnataka on May 22, 2010. The Boeing 737-800, coming from Dubai, plunged into a gorge beyond the tabletop runway and burst into flames, killing 158 people. The tragic incident brought increased scrutiny to India's tabletop airports and landing protocols during adverse conditions.

- Alliance Air Flight 7412 (2000): Alliance Air Flight 7412 crashed into a densely populated residential area in Bihar's Patna while attempting to land on July 17, 2000. The Boeing 737-200 experienced a stall at low altitude
- due to the reported improper handling during the final approach. Sixty people were killed, including five on the ground. The accident prompted upgrades to approach procedures at smaller urban airports. Charkhi Dadri mid-air collision
- (1996): On November 12, 1996, 349 people were killed in what became India's most devastating aviation disaster. The tragedy a Boeing 747, and Kazakhstan Airlines Flight 1907, an Ilyushin Il-76. collided mid-air near Charkhi Dadri in Haryana. The accident was the result of a communication failure and the Kazakh crew descending below their assigned altitude. Following the incident, India introduced significant aviation safety measures, including mandating the
- commercial aircraft Indian Airlines Flight 605 (1990): On February 14, 1990, Indian Airlines Flight 605 crashed while approaching Bengaluru's HAL Airport, killing 92 of the 146 people on board. The Airbus A320, a relatively new aircraft in India at the time, descended too low and hit the ground short of the runway, skidding onto a golf

- course. The investigation revealed that pilot error and unfamiliarity with the advanced digital cockpit of the A320 contributed to the tragic accident.
- Indian Airlines Flight 113 (1988): Amid poor visibility on October 19, 1988, Indian Airlines Flight 113, a Boeing 737-200, crashed on its approach to Ahmedabad Airport. The flight, arriving from Mumbai, struck trees and crashed short of the runway, killing 133 of the 135 people on board. Investigators pointed to pilot error, inadequate weather information, and procedural lapses by air traffic control.
- January 1, 1978, Dubai-bound Ai India Flight 855, a Boeing 747, plunged into the Arabian Sea shortly after taking off from Mumbai, killing all 213 people on board. The disaster occurred only 101 seconds into the flight when a faulty Attitude Director Indicator led the captain to misinterpret the aircraft's orientation. The crash took place in nighttime conditions over the sea, contributing to the crew's spatial disorientation.

Air India Flight 855 (1978): On

Indian Airlines Flight 440 (1973): On May 31, 1973, Indian Airlines Flight 440 crashed during its approach to Delhi's Palam Airport. The Boeing 737-200 encountered severe weather and struck high-tension wires just short of the runway. Of the 65 people on board, 48 died. Among the dead was prominent Indian politician Mohan Kumaramangalam.

According to 'Global Religious Landscape' report, by the Pew Research Center, the number of Hindus worldwide grew 12 per cent from 2010 to 2020, rising from a little less than 1.1 billion to nearly 1.2 billion. Since non-Hindus grew at about the same rate, Hindus remained stable as a percentage or share of the global population.

The report mainly focuses on seven categories: Christians, Muslims, Hindus, Buddhists, Jews, people who belong to other religions, and those who are religiously unaffiliated. "Over the decade from 2010 to 2020, the number (or count) of Hindus grew most quickly in the Middle East-NorthAfrica region, to 3.2 population rose to 3.6 million (up 55 per cent).

In these regions, Hindus grew at a faster rate than the non-Hindu population and growth was primarily driven by migrants moving to wealthy countries - such as the United States and the United ArabEmirates — for economic opportunities. Europe also saw a considerable increase,to 2.2 million (up 30 per cent)," it said. As a share of regional populations, Hindus grew modestly in the Asia-Pacific region (up 0.4 points) and in NorthAmerica (up 0.3 percentage points).

Hindus made up roughly one-quarter of the total population of Asia and the Pacific at the end of the decade. As of 2020, the Asia-Pacific region continues to be home to the vast majority of the world's Hindus (99 per cent).

The Remaining Hindus live mostly in North America or the Middle East-North Africaregion, where they make up 0.3 per cent in each region. There was a subtle shift in the geographic concentration of Hindus between 2010 and



The assertion came two days after Vadra failed to appear before the ED after he skipped the agency's summons on June 10 for questioning in a money laundering case linked to UKbased alleged arms consultant

Vadra, Wayanad MP's husband, was summoned by the probe agency to record his statement in the case on June 10 but could not appear as he had flu-like symptoms on June 9 and undertook a COVID test according to the health protocol. his lawyer said.

record his statement virtually but the agency did not accept the plea and wanted his physi cal presence to do the needful.

"My client Robert Vadra has been made aware of certain media reports that erroneously suggest that my Client has been avoiding ED summons. My client would like to bring the true facts to your attention and would like to state unequivocally that such media reports are completely untrue.

'Vadra has complied with all the ED summons, demands for information and documentation for the last ten years. He has repeatedly affirmed and demonstrated his full cooperation with the authorities and will continue his full cooperation as a law-abiding citizen of India." Khaitan said in a state-

He said Vadra received a summons to appear before the ED on June 10 in respect of a case in which he has already appeared before the agency on

"Any attempt to suggest that Mr. Vadra's attendance of his daughter's graduation ceremony is some sort of ruse to avoid attending any proceedings is completely untrue, unacceptable and without any basis in fact. This is especially clear from the fact that all foreign travels by Mr. Vadra, are always with prior notice to and knowledge of ED and with the prior permission of the Court.

"It is a matter of record with ED that Mr. Vadra has regularly and repeatedly appeared before the ED whenever summoned and there is no basis or reason to even think that Mr Vadra will ever try to give any untrue reason while asking for time to appear before ED," his lawyer asserted.

The way the NRC was carried out in Assam leaves a lot of scope for doubt, and it cannot be the only document for determining a person's citizenship, Sarma said.

The NRC, an official record of bonafide Indian citizens living in Assam, was updated under the supervision of the Supreme Court and released on August 31, 2019, leaving out more than 19 lakh applicants. However, it has not been notified by the Registrar General of India, leaving the controversial document without any official validity.

'Many people had entered their names in the NRC by using unfair means. So we have adopted the policy of pushing back (foreigners) if the authorities are absolutely convinced that the persons concerned are foreigners, the CM said on the sidelines of a programme in Darrang on Wednesday.

A large number of people have been picked up from across Assam since last month on suspicion of being doubtful citizens, as part of a nationwide drive, and many of them pushed back to Bangladesh. Some of them returned after the neighbouring nation refused to accept them as their citizens.

Asked whether a section of officials did not carry out the NRC exercise with due diligence, Sarma said that is a pos-

Sarma alleged that social activist and author Harsh Mander had camped in Assam for two years, and sent some youths from the state to America and England for education and encouraged them to manipulate the NRC.

"These matters came to my knowledge after I became the chief minister,' he said.

Sarma, speaking on detection and deportation of foreigners, during a special assembly session on June 9, had said the state government implement Immigrants (Expulsion from Assam) Act, 1950, for the purpose, which allows the district

commissioners to declare ille-

gal immigrants and evict them.

Terror funding case: Delhi HC denies bail to Kashmiri separatist leader Shabir Shah

⊣he Delhi High Court on Thursday refused to grant bail to Kashmiri separatist leader Shabir Ahmad Shah in a terror funding case. observing the possibility of him carrying out similar unlawful activities and influencing witnesses couldn't be ruled out.

A bench of Justices Navin Chawla and Shalinder Kaur said the Constitution of India provides for a right to freedom of speech and expression, but it also places reasonable restrictions such as public order, decency, morality or incitement to an offence.

'This right cannot be misused under the garb of carrying out rallies wherein, a person uses inflammatory speeches or instigates the public to commit unlawful activities, detrimental to the interest and integrity of the country," the

The high court, therefore, dismissed Shah's appeal against the trial court's July 7, 2023 order refusing bail. Shah was arrested by the

National Investigation Agency (NIA) on June 4, 2019. The high court also rejected Shah's alternate prayer seeking "house arrest" given the

serious nature of charges. In 2017, the NIA registered a case against 12 persons for allegations of conspiracy for raising and collecting funds for causing disruption by way of pelting stones, damaging public property and conspiring to wage war against the government of India.

Shah was alleged to have played a "substantial role" in facilitating a separatist or militant movement in Jammu and Kashmir by inciting and insti-

gating the general public to sloganeer in support of the secession of the J&K; paying tribute to the family of slain terrorists or militants by eulogising them as "martyrs"; receiving money through hawala transactions and raising funds through the LoC trade, which were allegedly used to fuel subversive and militant activities in J&K.

The high court observed he was the chairman of the unlawful organisation Jammu and Kashmir Democratic Freedom Party (JKDPF).

The bench examined a table elaborating on the 24 pending cases against Shah, indicating his involvement in a number of criminal cases of a similar nature and relating to conspiring for the secession of J&K from the union territory of India. These cases reflect extensive preparations and coordinated action undertaken in furtherance of that objec-

Opposing Shah's bail, the NIA counsel said the investigating agency had unearthed and collated substantial incriminating evidence against him and found that he played an active part in a deep-rooted conspiracy related to secessionist and terrorist activities in the J&K.

Shah's counsel argued at the time when his client was alleged to have been involved in various activities, his organisation hadn't been declared unlawful and that he was not involved in any illegal activity. The court, however, found no merit in the plea.

In case Shah was involved in unlawful activities, the high court said, the same couldn't be termed as lawful only because the organisation he was heading was at the time, was not declared an unlawful associa-

Falling Fertility Rate: Crisis or course correction

India's demographic story is changing and with it comes a new set of opportunities and challenges

India, with concerns about overpopulation, now faces a very different demographic dilemma - one marked not by too many births, but by too few. According to the UNFPA's State of World Population 2025 report, India's total fertility rate has dropped to 1.9, slipping below the replacement level of 2.1. This means that, on average, Indian women are having fewer children than required to maintain the population size over time. While India remains the most populous country in the world with a population of 1.46 billion, the nature of this growth is undergoing a significant shift. The days of large families are fading, replaced by a quieter but deeply transformative trend of smaller households and fewer births. This decline in fertility didn't occur overnight. It is the cumulative outcome of decades of social progress and change. More girls are completing their education. Access to contraceptives and reproductive health services has expanded. Urbanisation has reshaped lifestyles and aspirations. Cultural norms are evolving, with more women delaying marriage, entering the workforce, and asserting autonomy over reproductive decisions.

In 1960, the average Indian woman had nearly six children. Today, that number has fallen to less than two. This change is more than a demographic trend; it is a powerful indicator of women's empowerment. The falling fertility rate brings with it several positive implications. First and foremost, it reflects an increase in personal choice, particularly for women. It signifies that more individuals now have the option to decide if, when, and how many children they wish to have. As life expectancy rises currently at 74 for women and 71 for men - India will inevitably face a growing elderly population.

But this would also have negative impact as well. The country must prepare for a future in which fewer young workers support a larger ageing population. This could place immense pressure on public healthcare, social welfare systems, and family structures. A declining fertility rate can eventually lead to a shrinking labour force, which, over time, may hinder economic productivity and growth. Countries like Japan, Italy, and South Korea are already grappling with such consequences. India, though better placed demographically at the moment, must take lessons from their experiences to avoid similar pitfalls in the future.

Equally important is the need to address the deep regional and socioeconomic disparities that continue to exist within India. While urban, educated families may be voluntarily choosing to have fewer children, many women in rural and low-income communities still lack access to adequate reproductive healthcare and have limited control over their reproductive choices. This uneven access undermines the very foundation of progress that falling fertility is supposed to represent. Therefore, India's falling fertility rate should not be viewed with alarm, but neither should it be met with complacency. It is not a crisis, but it is a signal - a call for thoughtful planning and inclusive policy. As the UNFPA rightly emphasises, the focus should not be on population panic but on empowering people to make informed, autonomous decisions about their reproductive lives.

Trump takes aim at Ivy League

In a controversial campaign, President Donald Trump has launched an aggressive offensive against America's most prestigious universities, particularly ly League institutions, through funding cuts, policy investigations, and harsh rhetoric

S President Donald Trump has targeted top US universities during his second term. He has been waging a war on Ivy League universities for the past few weeks. He has particularly targeted institutions such as Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Columbia, Cornell, Brown, Dartmouth, and the University of Pennsylvania.

This move has shocked the American higher education system. Academia now faces a significant challenge fighting against the administration. Trump's attacks also have a political dimension. They are viewed as a conservative strategy to reduce the influence of liberalism in higher education. They could be aimed at eroding the Party's Democratic traditional support base.

The affected universities, which include those with funding cuts, are located in areas where the Democrats received strong support. Many of these institutions are now facing funding cuts and grant restrictions, which have significantly impacted their research and educational programmes. Conservatives have often complained about a bias in these institutions. Some view that these are part of the Trump administration's effort to reshape higher

One speculation is that Trump harbours resentment towards Ivy League schools for not granting him an honorary degree or inviting him to speak at graduation, despite his graduation from the Wharton School. Most recent American presidents have graduated from Ivy League universities, including Trump, who attended the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania.

In the first few months of 2024, the Trump administration has moved aggressively to strip federal funding from prominent colleges and universities. On March 10, the administration took action against Harvard, Columbia, NYU, and 60 other insti-

tutions. It also started investigations into possible violations of the Civil Rights Act due to incidents of antisemitic harassment. More than \$10 billion in research grants have been cut.

Immigration and Customs Enforcement has apprehended student activists. International students are not eligible for admission to Harvard, which also risks losing its tax exemption status. Trump has also banned international students from attending Harvard.

Harvard risks losing its tax-exempt status. These actions have raised tensions



have also suspended hundreds of millions in research grants. The Department of Education is investigating ten universities for alleged antisemitism and has warned others that similar inquiries may occur. Furthermore, it is examining 52 universities for illegal race-based projects.

Trump has introduced new guidelines aimed at limiting international student admissions, including a cap on visas, and he has publicly criticised Harvard, stating, 'Harvard needs to behave itself."

The confrontation marked a dramatic battle between Harvard, America's oldest

and wealthiest University, and the president, Donald Trump. "Everyone knows that Harvard has lost its way," Trump posted in X. "Harvard is a JOKE, teaches Hate and Stupidity, and should no longer receive Federal Funds."

Harvard is hard hit both financially and otherwise. They include funding cuts and agreeing to follow new federal oversight rules, including scrutiny of curricula, admissions, and research priorities. Taking legal action, Harvard has initiated court proceedings and received temporary relief when a federal judge suspended the policy that restricted international students from obtaining visas.

As to the reason for Trump targeting the Ivy League institutions, the administration has offered various explanations. Some believe that during the 2024 Presidential campaign, Trump pledged to cut funding and accreditation for colleges that propagate "antisemitic propaganda."

After he returned to the White House in 2024, Trump launched a campaign targeting Ivy League schools. The White House says this campaign was prompted by concerns that these schools are not doing enough to deal with antisemitism on their campuses.

This concern has grown due to the anti-Israel protests at US universities since the Gaza conflict escalated. It is unclear how long the Trump versus Academia confrontation will continue. It all depends on how long the affected institutions can withstand the pressure. Will it fight back or comply with the White House? Even if the targeted universities refuse to change their policies soon, some will start changing on their own. For example, Michigan, Ohio State, and the University of California have

already made changes, and more to follow.

International students hoping to join these elite institutions now face uncertainty and must consider alternatives in other countries. They contribute vast amounts of dollars mainly to the US economy. Some are considering universities in other countries as alternatives. It is said that it takes years to build an institution but only moments to tear one down. The conflict is escalating, and the affected universities may pursue more legal avenues. If it continues, American universities may lose talent, even as the Trump administration doubles down on its actions.

A Silent Revolution in Justice Delivery

he Legal Aid Defense Counsel System (LADCS) in India is emerging as a critical initiative to enhance access to justice for the poor and marginalized. Launched by the National Legal Services Authority (NALSA), LADCS operationalises the constitutional rights to life and personal liberty (Article 21) and the state's duty to provide free legal aid (Article 39A).

The system adopts a public defender-style approach, a shift from the previous model relying on part-time empaneled lawyers. LADCS ensures full-time, salaried legal professionals are deployed in every district under the District Legal Services Authority

These teams are typically structured with a Chief Legal Aid Defense Counsel, Deputy Chief, and Assistant Legal Aid Defense Counsels, aiming for consistency, accountability, and dedicat-

As a Legal Aid Defense Counsel in Gautam Buddh Nagar, the author highlights the practical impact of LADCS in bridging the gap between vulnerable individuals and the justice system. Their responsibilities extend beyond

courtroom appearances to include advocacy, strategy, counseling, and coordination. They manage bail applica-

tions, revisions, and appeals, monitor case progress, and Committee responsible for evaluating LADCs' perforprovide continuous legal assistance throughout criminal proceedings. Collaboration with jail authorities, court staff, police, and families is also integral to protecting the rights

of the accused. A key component of LADCS is the mandatory weekly jail visit protocol. During these visits, LADCs identify undertrial prisoners lacking legal representation or understanding of their cases, often their first interaction with the legal system after extended periods. They offer legal counseling, assess bail or discharge possibilities, and draft necessary legal documents.

Furthermore, LADCs report issues like custodial abuse, illegal detention, or procedural delays to the DLSA, contributing to both individual justice and systemic transparency. To uphold professionalism and integrity, NALSA's LADCS Scheme (2022) outlines operational and ethical guidelines.

Defense counsels are required to maintain client confidentiality, act without bias, and uphold individual dignity. Meticulous recordkeeping of case files, court orders, jail visit notes, and monthly reports is mandated, with review by the DLSA. Significantly, LADCs are prohibited from private practice, ensuring their undivided focus on legal aid and prevent-

ing conflicts of interest. Each district also has a Monitoring and Mentoring mance, with the authority to recommend disciplinary action for negligence or misconduct.

This institutional oversight aims to strengthen public confidence and professional accountability. LADCs are also expected to approach their work with empathy and social awareness, particularly in sensitive cases involving women, juveniles, disabled persons, or individuals from SC/ST or minority backgrounds, promoting a human-centric approach to justice.

From ground-level experience, the LADCS has shown tangible impact in Gautam Buddh Nagar, with many undertrial prisoners gaining access to bail, updates, and rightful representation.

By accelerating legal processes, LADCS helps reduce case backlogs and decongest jails, simultaneously restoring faith in the justice system. Courts also benefit from better-prepared defense counsels, leading to smoother case management. The system is not just about free legal services but about providing quality, ethical, and consistent representation.

While challenges like increasing awareness, addressing staff shortages, and expanding reach persist, LADCS is proving to be a foundational pillar of legal empowerment in India, defending constitutional values, human dignity, and the essence of justice for all.

California on the brink

California, home to Hollywood, Disneyland, America's busiest port, and now the world's fourth-largest economy, is facing a serious crisis. President Donald Trump has controversially invoked Title 10 authority to deploy 700 National Guard troops to Los Angeles without the consent of Governor Gavin Newsom — a likely presidential candidate. Alarming reports suggest the troops have been instructed to arrest the Governor

The crisis stems from aggressive ICE raids in Los Angeles, Compton, and Paramount, which led to over 100 arrests and sparked widespread protests. These quickly turned violent, with incidents of looting, arson, and vehicle ramming.

Governor Newsom has launched legal action against the federal move, while US Marines are also being deployed, raising concerns about military force being used against civilians.

Over 100 arrests during aggressive ICE raids have triggered unrest, prompting President Trump to invoke Title 10 and send 700 National Guard troops — reportedly with orders to detain the Governor if he obstructs. With Marines joining the scene and 54 per cent of Americans supporting the President, California faces a growing crisis with national implications and an uncertain resition.

One nation one temperature! Power Minister Manohar Lal Khattar's proposal to regu-

late AC temperatures so that they don't go below 20 degrees Celsius has been met with backlash by citizens worried that the Modi Government is interfering a little too much. It has pitted the 'greater good' of energy conservation against the consumer's right to choose. 'One nation, one temperature' and other hashtags are gaining ground on social media. The timing of the announcement — it was made as the country reels under extreme heat — has also been criticised.

New air conditioners in the Indian market will soon not go below 20 degrees, Khattar said Tuesday, referring to a 'new provision" which he said would be "implemented soon". He pitched it as a bid to bring energy efficiency in the \$3 billion AC market in the country. If the Government has its way, 'temperature standardisation' norms will apply to new AC units for malls, homes and cars that are manufactured and sold after this proposal comes into effect.

Many citizens have raised concerns about what they see as the Government infringing upon their choices as customers. Others argued that in the backdrop of rising temperatures, the Government should be working to make ACs more accessible for consumers, rather than bringing in "firstworld" policies to the country. "What next, cars that can't drive below 20 km/h and above 60 km/h," remarked Supreme Court Advocate Sanjay Hegde.

Gandhi's 'Indian Opinion' and its message for the digital age

In today's digital world of misinformation and fleeting outrage, Gandhi's model of principled media — anchored in trust, restraint and purpose — offers a timeless blueprint for using technology to serve truth, not trends



n June 4, 1903, Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi launched The Indian Opinion in South Africa, a publication that became a vital tool in his struggle against racial injustice. As detailed by Ela Gandhi in her book, "Mahatma Gandhi and the Media — The Indian Opinion" a publication of the National Gandhi Museum, New Delhi, the seeds of this resistance were sown on June 7, 1893, when Gandhi, despite holding a valid first-class ticket, was forcibly ejected from a train at Pietermaritzburg due to his race.

That freezing night in the station's waiting room marked a turning point; he resolved to stay and resist injustice instead of returning home. He also telegrammed the railway manager, urging corrective action against such discriminatory conduct. Ela Gandhi writes, "On that night, he rejected the idea of abandoning his case and immediately returning home to a life of dignity and respect. He rejected the idea of succumbing to the insults and accepting them as a way of life in South Africa. He decided instead to stay on and confront and transform the racist system".

His activism in South Africa spanned over two decades (1893-1914). During this period, he developed and refined his unique philosophy of non-violent resistance, which he termed "Satyagraha" (truth-force). He organised mass protests, boycotts, and civil disobedience campaigns against discriminatory laws, such as the Black Act (which required Indians to carry registration certificates) and the £3 poll tax (In 1913, the South African Government introduced a £3 tax on Indians, (mainly those who had completed their indentured labour contracts).

These struggles often led to (direct) confrontations with the authorities, and Gandhi, along with thousands of other Indians, faced numerous arrests and endured harsh prison sentences. His imprison-


ments — further drew attention to unjust laws through non-violent means — and were a deliberate act of civil disobedience for a righteous cause, further solidifying his resolve to fight injustice.

Ela Gandhi notes that Gandhi had "Written hundreds of letters to the press about the irking racism and the various injustices suffered by South Africans. He wrote about the wretched conditions of service that the indentured

workers were subject to in South Africa. He produced the famous green pamphlet to discourage Indians from being lured into indenture by false stories and promises".

Mahatma Gandhi's strategic use of alternative media was both innovative and deliberate. Deeply conscious of the press's influence, he also recognised



the ethical responsibilities inherent in journalism. As Ela Gandhi notes, "He was also aware of the responsibility that a journalist carried. As a writer or journalist, he constantly exercised discipline over himself to ensure that his reporting was balanced." The persistent injustices faced by the Indian community in South Africa, along with the imperative for organised resistance, prompted Gandhi to launch 'The Indian Opinion' Recognising the inadequacy and bias of the white-owned press, he envisioned a medium that would serve not only as a newspaper but also as a pedagogical tool for disseminating the principles of Satyagraha. It became a critical platform for mobilisation and dialogue, anchoring the nascent Indian civil rights movement.

The Indian Opinion' began as a bilingual (later trilingual and quadrilingual) weekly, published in Gujarati, Hindi, Tamil, and English. Its primary objective was to articulate the grievances of the Indian community in South Africa, combat racial discrimination, and foster unity among diverse linguistic and religious groups. Mahatma Gandhi himself meticulously managed its production, writing a significant portion of its content, editing, and even doing manual labour at the press. The paper reported on legal cases, documented instances of injustice, provided educational content and served as a forum for community discussions. Through

'The Indian Opinion', Mohandas Karamchand Gandhi didn't just report the news; he shaped it, guiding his readers towards a deeper understanding of their collective plight and the imperative for non-violent resistance, and, simultaneously, Gandhi's evolution as a leader.

Today, in a world grappling with the rise of divisive narratives and the proliferation of 'fake news,' 'The Indian Opinion's' commitment to truth and ethical communication remains profoundly relevant. The digital age has democratised information but has also unleashed a torrent of misinformation, making the discerning reader an endangered species. Imagine Gandhi in the 21st century, armed not with a hand-cranked printing press but with a smartphone.

Mahatma Gandhi might have leveraged social media platforms to disseminate his message in an era of instant gratification and viral content. His iconic quotes could become powerful memes, his calls to action amplified through trending hashtags. However, he would likely approach these tools with extreme caution, prioritising authentic engagement over superficial popularity.

He would use social media not for self-promotion, but for genuine community mobilisation, echoing the words of the Canadian philosopher Marshall McLuhan, "The medium is the message."

For Gandhi, the message was always truth and non-violence, and the medium would be moulded to serve that higher purpose. Just as 'The Indian Opinion' served as a hub for organising protests and passive resistance campaigns, a modern-day 'Indian Opinion' would perhaps be deeply embedded in online activism. It would facilitate virtual meetings, organise digital petitions, and livestream acts of nonviolent civil disobedience.

Going forward with what Marshall McLuhan had said, Gandhi would not have succumbed to popularity metrics like 'likes' or 'followers'. Instead, as historian Ramachandra Guha in his book 'Gandhi Before India notes, Gandhi "was never interested in public applause... he was interested in public awakening"

awakening".

Gandhi's commitment to self-sufficiency and ethical production was evident in 'The Indian Opinion's' operation. He believed in local control and minimising reliance on external, often exploitative, systems. In today's tech landscape, this translates into a powerful critique of centralised digital platforms and data monopolies.

Mahatma Gandhi might have advocated for data privacy — as it is one of the greatest dangers people are facing. Further, going by his 'dharma' (righteous principles), Mahatma Gandhi would have advocated for ethical algorithms, transparent data practices, and the responsible use of artificial intelligence (AI), while cautioning about the dangers of the addictive nature of social media.

American media theorist Evgeny Morozov (2011) argues that online activism often gives a false sense of accomplishment — 'clicks have replaced commitment.' Mahatma Gandhi would challenge this hollow activism and call for real-world consequences. "It is not enough to be passively good; we must be actively good," he once wrote (Collected Works of Mahatma Gandhi, Vol. 27, p. 164). 'The Indian Opinion' of the 21st century would, therefore, focus on 'converting online energy into offline results'. Today's journalists often find themselves caught between TRPs, clicks, and ethical compromise. A 2020 Reuters Institute report lamented the declining public trust in mainstream media globally. Gandhi's 'Indian Opinion', however, would choose 'trust over traffic'.

If the 'charkha' (spinning wheel) was Gandhi's symbol of resistance and regeneration in the 20th century, the smartphone — used mindfully — could become its 21st-century equivalent. Mahatma would strongly advocate for its use with restraint, truth, and compassion.

Last, but not the least, Mahatma Gandhi did not romanticise suffering, nor did he glamourise technology. He was pragmatic yet principled. His digital philosophy would be grounded in Satyagraha—not just in 'content', but in 'conduct'. His "The Indian Opinion" served that purpose.

Redefining the Capital: Modi Govt drives massive infra push across Delhi

rom Dehradun Expressway to Meerut

Expressway and Central Vista to Bharat Mandapam — PM Modi executed projects worth approximately 1.50 lakh Crore in the national capital during his 11 years of tenure in the centre since May 26, 2014. Besides spending ₹53,000 crore on Delhi Metro projects, the central Government says around ₹68,000 crore has been directly spent on Delhi's development in the last decade. Furthermore, Detailed Project Reports (DPR) have been prepared for new infrastructure worth ₹24,000 crore in the pipeline. A major portion of the spending, nearly ₹41,000 crore, has gone into road infrastructure, while ₹15,000 crore was allocated to railway-related projects. Another ₹12,000 crore has been invested in airport-related infrastructure and surrounding connectivity. Projects like the Delhi-Merut Expressway, the Pragati Maidan tunnel, Dwarka Expressway, Urban Extension Road, and the Central Vista redevelopment have been some of the most visible changes that citizens can witness across the city.

Among the biggest completed projects is the Delhi-Meerut Expressway, which has cut down travel time to Meerut to just 45 minutes. This road has significantly improved the daily commute for residents in NCR towns. It is also part of a larger effort to expand high-speed corridors across India. The Government is also building the Delhi-

Mumbai Expressway, aiming to reduce the travel time between the two cities to about 12 hours. The Eastern and Western Peripheral Expressways, which had been stalled for years due to issues between state Governments, were completed during this period. These bypass highways were planned to divert heavy vehicular traffic away from Delhi. With an estimated 50,000 trucks that previously passed through the capital every day now using these routes, traffic congestion and air pollution in the city have seen some relief.

In addition to major expressways, the

Urban Extension Road-II, built at a cost of over ₹ 7,700 crore, has created an alternative route connecting north and west Delhi to the airport and south Delhi. The road is expected to ease pressure on congested internal roads, especially for commuters from Haryana, Punjab, and Jammu and Kashmir who often face bottlenecks entering Delhi. While this road was originally the Delhi Government's responsibility, it was taken over by the National Highways Authority of India, with full support from the Centre. One of the key projects in central Delhi is the redevelopment of Central Vista, a project that has stirred both political and public debate. It includes the new Parliament building, which was completed in under four years. The Kartavya Path, formerly known as Rajpath, has also been redesigned under this project. Earlier plagued by traffic and poor pedestrian access, the area now



features better walkways, underground passages, and landscaping. The wider Central Vista plan includes the upcoming Central Secretariat complex, where several Government ministries will be housed under one roof. Another key transport intervention has been the Pragati Maidan Integrated Transit Corridor. Built to address traffic congestion during major events at the Pragati Maidan exhibition grounds, the corridor includes a tunnel that provides signal-free movement between Mandi House and east Delhi. This project has led to a significant reduction i n jams at ITO and on Mathura Road. It also

includes parking facilities for thousands of vehicles and several underground Uturns to manage traffic flow.

Near the airport, two major convention centres have been established — Bharat Mandapam and Yashobhoomi. Bharat Mandapam, located at Pragati Maidan, hosted the G20 summit and now serves as a venue for large national and international conferences.

Its construction also transformed the surrounding infrastructure, including roads and metro access. Yashobhoomi, built over 221 acres with an investment

of around ₹25,000 crores, is among the largest convention centres in Asia and can host up to 20,000 people at once. It is well-connected by metro and roads such as the Dwarka Expressway and UER-II. Efforts have also been made to boost rail-based regional connectivity. The first phase of the Delhi-Merut Regional Rapid Transit System, or RRTS, branded as Namo Bharat, is now operational between Delhi and a part of Meerut. When complete, the corridor will drastically reduce commute time between the two cities. Similar corridors have been proposed from Delhi to Panipat and Delhi to Alwar. These high-speed transit lines aim to bring surrounding towns into the fold of daily commuting zones, reducing the dependence on road travand offering an alternative to private vehicles.

Several projects have focused on improving the internal infrastructure of the city. The flyover at

Dhaula Kuan, for instance, was finally constructed after years of delay caused by land availability issues. The flyover eased movement between west Delhi and the airport. Another area of focus has been urban housing and the regularisation of settlements. Under the PM-UDAY scheme, efforts have been made to provide ownership rights to residents of over 1,700 unauthorised colonies. Around 29,000 houses have been sanctioned under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Urban), and 3,000 flats for economically weaker sections were built with a total outlay of around ₹354 crore.

New public infrastructure has also included educational and cultural facilities such as the Veer Savarkar College at Delhi University, the Prime Minister's Museum, the Police Memorial, and the National War Memorial. Oxygen parks and green zones have also been developed in several parts of the city, intended as both environmental measures and public recreation spaces. In public transport, Delhi received support from the Centre for expanding its fleet of electric buses under the FAME scheme. The central Government funded a substantial portion of the cost of these non-polluting buses. Several projects are currently in the pipeline. Detailed Project Reports have been prepared for new infrastructure worth ₹24,000 crores, spanning over 120 kilometres. Among these are a 7-kilometre tunnel from Shiv Murti to Nelson Mandela Road, an elevated road connecting INA to the airport with possible extensions to Gurugram and Faridabad, and further extensions of UER-II to connect Alipur, Tronica City, and the Delhi-Dehradun route. A feasibility study is also being conducted for a tunnel connecting Sarai Kale Khan to IGI Airport, which could transform airport access for south and east Delhi residents. From new highways and tunnels to convention centres and transit corridors, the national capital has seen rapid transformation one that is reshaping how the city moves, works, and presents itself to the world.

Beyond the Optics: Why India's Strategic Focus Has Moved Past RIC

hen Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov recently called for the revival of the Russia-India-China (RIC) trilateral dialogue, it echoed a familiar, if somewhat outdated, diplomatic refrain. Labeling RIC as an "independent mechanism," Lavrov argued that the moment is ripe for its reinvigoration — especially given the reported easing of India-China border tensions. On the surface, it sounded like a classic Eurasian initiative: three major powers coming together to balance global influence and reinforce multipolarity. But in substance, the call appears more symbolic than strategic, driven less by genuine trust and more by Moscow's shifting compulsions.

Originally conceptualised in the late 1990s, RIC was born out of a common need among the three nations to counterbalance Western dominance and to claim space in global decision-making. At the time, the idea of a trilateral dialogue made sense — India, Russia, and China were navigating a unipolar world, seeking to shape a more balanced international order. However, over the past two decades, the geopolitical context has transformed significantly. The foundational logic behind RIC has weakened as each member has chosen distinct strategic paths.

India's foreign policy has evolved through sustained engagements with a host of global actors — particularly the Indo-Pacific Quad (with the U.S., Japan, and Australia), France, and key Southeast Asian partners. These relationships are grounded in values like transparency, sovereignty, and a rules-based international system-values that China does not share. Beijing's military posturing along the Line of Actual Control, its strategic penetration into the Indian Ocean, and its use of economic coercion have deeply eroded trust in New Delhi.

Even Lavrov's claim of reduced border tensions is disputable. While disengagement has occurred in some friction zones, the larger strategic environment remains tense. Post-Galwan, India's diplo-

matic recalibration has been clear: less sentimentalism, more realism. New Delhi is no longer willing to engage in platforms that pay lip service to unity while ignoring hard truths. RIC, under these conditions, appears increasingly disconnected from the region's evolving security landscape.

Russia's position further complicates the equation. While defence and energy ties with India remain strong, Moscow's growing dependency on China — intensified by Western sanctions — undermines its role as a neutral partner. This tilt is not lost on India. Moscow's silence on Chinese aggression and its quiet alignment with Pakistani narratives in multilateral forums have not gone unnoticed. A recent decision to collaborate with Pakistan in reviving a Soviet-era steel plant only reinforces the perception of Russia's pivot away from India's sensitivities.

Given these shifts, Lavrov's push for RIC should

be seen for what it is: a diplomatic move by Russia to maintain relevance in Asia without Western interference. RIC offers Moscow a platform, even if only symbolically, to present itself as a balancer. But symbolism alone does not constitute strategy. For RIC to be viable, it would require political will, mutual trust, and convergence on key issues — all of which

India, to its credit, does not reject any multilateral platform outright. It continues to engage in RIC, BRICS, and the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation. However, such participation is pragmatic, not preferential. These forums are now largely diplomatic stages rather than engines for transformative change. India's real focus lies on groupings where its values and strategic goals align with those of its partners. Moreover, India's democratic ethos increasingly diverges from the authoritarian and opaque governance styles of Russia and China. This divergence is more than ideological — it affects everything from crisis response to geopolitical alignment. Without shared principles and trust, trilateral mechanisms like RIC risk producing hollow rhetoric instead of substantive results.

It's also important to recognise that India isn't seeking to distance itself completely from either China or Russia. What it desires is strategic autonomy—

the ability to act in its own interest without being tied down by legacy frameworks or

false notions of equidistance.

In this context, dialogue remains important, but only when it is based on reciprocity, mutual respect, and a willingness to address core concerns. Beijing's attempt to compartmentalise its relationship with India — engaging economically while maintaining military standoffs — is something New Delhi has actively resisted. Under such conditions, expecting India to re-engage meaningfully in RIC amounts to ignoring ground realities. Any revival that does not address the

trust deficit will remain superficial — serving little purpose beyond optics. Finally, the idea of multipolarity that once inspired RIC has itself evolved.

Today, the global order is shaped less by traditional power blocs and more by flexible, issue-based coalitions. India's active role in areas like digital governance, climate action, and global health demonstrates this shift. RIC no longer fits into this dynamic, forward-looking vision. Lavrov's appeal to revive RIC may resonate with diplomatic nostalgia, but it lacks contemporary relevance. The world has changed, and so has India. Clinging to outdated formats risks diverting attention from more effective collaborations. India's future lies in agile, purposeful, and valuesaligned partnerships. Dialogue is welcome, but only if it's grounded in realism — not rhetoric.

World leaders express condolences to plane crash's families

N Secretary General Antonio Guterres, Russian President Vladimir Putin and Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney were among scores of world leaders who offered condolences to the people of India in wake of the plane crash in Ahmedabad on Thursday.

A London-bound Air İndia plane carrying 242 passengers and crew crashed in a residential area in Ahmedabad minutes after taking off. Many people are feared killed.

There were 169 Indians, 53 British, one Canadian and seven Portuguese nationals onboard apart from 12 crew members.

President Putin offered condolences to Indian President Droupadi Murmu and Prime Minister Narendra Modi and expressed "deepest condolences," over the plane crash, the Kremlin said

"Please convey my sympathy and support to the families of those killed and my wishes for a swift recovery to those injured in the crash," TASS said, quoting Putin's message.

Canada's Prime Minister Mark Carney said he is "devastated" to learn about the crash that had one Canadian national among those on board.

"My thoughts are with the loved ones of everyone on board. Canada's transportation officials are in close contact with counterparts and I am receiving regular updates as the response to this tragedy unfolds," Carney said in a post on X. Minister of Foreign Affairs Anita Anand too called it the "distressing news" as

with our international partners. My thoughts are with the families and loved ones of those who have been lost in this tragedy," she said in a post on X. UN Secretary General Guterres said he is "deeply saddened" by the Air India crash and, in a post on X, offered "heartfelt condolences" to the families and loved ones of all affected.

"Heartbreaking news from India with the tragic plane crash in Ahmedabad. My deepest condolences to the families and loved ones grieving this terrible loss. We share your pain. 
US Secretary Of State Marco Rubio too expressed condolences, saying Washington continues to monitor developments and stands with the emergency responders working to help those impacted.

House to vote on Trump's request to cut funding for NPR, PBS

ouse Republicans are moving to cut about \$9.4 billion in spending already approved by Congress as President Donald Trump's administration looks to follow through on work by the Department of Government Efficiency when it was overseen by Elon Musk.

The package to be voted on Thursday targets foreign aid programs and the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, which provides money for National Public Radio and the Public Broadcasting Service, as well as thousands of public radio and television stations around the country. Republicans are characterising the spending as wasteful and unnecessary, but Democrats say the rescissions are hurting the United States' standing in the world.

"Cruelty is the point," Democratic leader Hakeem Jeffries of New York said of the proposed spending cuts.

The Trump administration is employing a tool rarely used in recent years that allows the president to transmit a request to Congress to cancel previously appropriated funds. That triggers a 45-day clock in which the funds are frozen pending congressional action. If Congress fails to act within that period, then the spending stands.

The benefit for the administration of a formal rescissions request is that passage requires only a simple majority in the 100-member Senate instead of the 60 votes usually required to get spending bills through that chamber. So, if they stay united, Republicans will be able to pass the measure without any Democratic votes. The administration is likening the first rescissions package to a test case and says more could be on the way if Congress goes along.

Republicans, sensitive to concerns that Trump's sweeping tax and immigration bill would increase future federal deficits, are anxious to demonstrate spending discipline, though the cuts in the package amount to just a sliver of the spending approved by Congress each year. They are betting the cuts prove popular with constituents who align with Trump's "America first" ideology as well as those who view NPR and PBS as having a liberal bias.

In all, the package contains 21 proposed rescissions. Approval would claw back about \$900 million from \$10 billion that Congress has approved for global health programs. That includes cancelling \$500 million for activities related to infectious diseases and child and maternal health and another \$400 million to address the global HIV epidemic. The Trump administra-

tion is also looking to cancel \$800 million, or a quarter of the amount Congress approved, for a program that provides emergency shelter, water and sanitation and family reunification for those forced to flee their own country.

About 45 per cent of the savings sought by the White House would come from two programs designed to boost the economies, democratic institutions and civil societies in developing countries.

The Republican president has also asked lawmakers to rescind nearly \$1.1 billion from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, which represents the full amount it's slated to receive during the next two budget years. About two-thirds of the money gets distributed to more than 1,500 locally owned public radio and televi sion stations. Nearly half of those stations serve rural areas of the country.

The association representing local public television stations warns that many of them would be forced to close if the Republican measure passes. Those stations provide emergency alerts, free educational programming and high school sports coverage and highlight hometown heroes. Advocacy groups that serve the world's poorest people are also sounding the alarm and urging lawmakers to vote no.

Russia targets Ukraine with new attacks, 3 killed

ussian forces have pummelled Ukraine with Adrones and other weapons, killing three people and injuring scores of others despite international pressure to accept a ceasefire, officials said Thursday. According to the Ukrainian air force, Russia launched a barrage of 63 drones and decoys at Ukraine overnight. It said that air defences destroyed 28 drones while another 21 were jammed.

Ukraine's police said two people were killed and six were injured over the past 24 hours in the eastern Donetsk region, the focus of the Russian offensive. One person was killed and 14 others were also injured in the southern Kherson region, which is partly occupied by Russian forces, police said. The head of the Kharkiv

region, Oleh Syniehubov, said that 15 people, including four children, were injured by Russian drone attacks overnight. Kharkiv city mayor Ihor Terekhov said Russian drones targeted residential districts, educational facilities, kindergartens and other civilian infrastructure. "Kharkiv is holding on.

People are alive. And that is the most important thing," Terekhov said.

The Russian military has launched waves of drones and missiles in recent days, with a record bombardment of almost 500 drones on Monday and a wave of 315 drones and seven missiles overnight on Tuesday. The recent escalation in aerial attacks has come alongside a renewed Russian battlefield push along eastern and northeastern parts of the more than 1,000-kilometre front line.

While Russian missile and drone barrage have struck regions all across Ukraine, regions along the front line have faced daily Russian attacks with short-range exploding drones and glide bombs. Ukraine hit back with drone raids.

Russia's Defence Ministry said that air defences downed 52 Ukrainian drones early Thursday, including 41 over the Belgorod region that borders Ukraine. Regional Gov. Vyacheslav Gladkov said three

people were injured by Jkrainian attacks Thursday.

The attacks have continued despite discussions of a potential ceasefire in the war. During their June 2 talks in Istanbul, Russian and Ukrainian negotiators traded memorandums containing sharply divergent conditions that both sides see as nonstarters, making any quick deal unlikely. Speaking at a meeting of leaders of southeast European countries in Odesa, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy urged the European Union to toughen its latest package of sanctions against Russia. He argued that lowering the cap on the price of Russian oil from \$60 to \$45 as the bloc has proposed

"Real peace comes with a

\$30 cap — that's the level that will truly change thinking in

Moscow," Zelenskyy said. German Defence Minister Boris Pistorius arrived in Kyiv Thursday on an unannounced visit, noting that the steppedup Russian attacks on Ukraine send a message from Moscow that it has "no interest in a peaceful solution at present," according to German news

Pistorius said his visit underlines that the new German Government continues to stand by Ukraine.

"Of course this will also be about how the support of Germany and other Europeans will look in future — what we can do, for example, in the area of industrial cooperation, but also other support," he said.

Jaishankar meets French President

Jaishankar is on a visit to Europe to boost bilateral ties and reaffirm India's policy of zero-tolerance against terrorism, especially in the wake of April 22 Pahalgam terror

"Honoured to call on President @EmmanuelMacron of France. Conveyed greetings of PM @narendramodi. Thanked him for France's strong message of support in the fight against terrorism," Jaishankar said in a post on X after the meeting.

"Our discussions reflected the trust, comfort and ambition of our Strategic Partnership," he added.

Jaishankar was in Brussels on Wednesday where he met top European Union leaders and discussed ways to further strengthen the EU-India strategic partnership. The April 22 Pahalgam terror attack that claimed 26 lives prompted India to carry out precision strikes on terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistanoccupied Kashmir on May 7.

UN nuclear watchdog finds Iran not complying with obligations

→he UN nuclear watchdog's board of governors on Thursday formally found that Iran isn't complying with its nuclear obligations for the first time in 20 years, a move that could lead to further tensions and set in motion an effort to restore United Nations sanctions on Tehran later this year.

Iran reacted immediately. saying it will establish a new enrichment facility "in a secure location" and that "other measures are also being planned." 'The Islamic Republic of Iran has no choice but to respond to this political resolution," the Iranian Foreign Ministry and Atomic Energy Organisation of Iran said in a ioint statement.

Nineteen countries on the International Atomic Energy Agency's board, which represents the agency's member nations, voted for the resolution, according to diplomats

who spoke on condition of anonymity to describe the outcome of the closed-doors vote.

Russia, China and Burkina Faso opposed it, 11 abstained and two did not vote. In the draft resolution seen by The Associated Press, the board of governors renews a call on Iran to provide answers "without delay" in a long-running investigation into uranium traces found at several locations that Tehran has failed to declare as nuclear sites.

Western officials suspect that the uranium traces could provide evidence that Iran had a secret nuclear weapons program until 2003. The resolution was put forward by France, the UK, Germany and the US. Iran under pressure as Trump warns of possible airstrikes

Speaking to Iranian state television after the vote, the spokesman for the Atomic Energy Organisation of Iran said that his agency immediately informed the IAEA of 'specific and effective" actions Tehran would take.

Hamas says it killed 12 Israeli-backed fighters

The aid group's operations in Gaza have already been marred by controversy and violence since they began last month, with scores of people killed in near-daily shootings as crowds headed toward the food distri-

Netanyahu survives attempt to dissolve parliament

sraeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's ▲Government survived an attempt to dissolve parliament early Thursday morning, with most of his ultra-Orthodox coalition partners joining him in voting against a bill that would have forced them to register for military service while the country is at war.

The vote was the most serious challenge to Netanyahu's government since Hamas' October 7, 2023, attack, the biggest security failure in Israel's history and the trigger for the ongoing war in Gaza. The bill's failure means that

no other bill to dissolve Knesset can be submitted for at least six months, shoring up Netanyahu's embattled coalition. The ultra-Orthodox parties are furious that the Government has failed to pass a law exempting their community from mandatory military service. The issue has long divided the Jewish Israeli public, especially during the 20month war in the Gaza Strip.



Israel's opposition had hoped that the public anger over the exemptions would help topple the government. But just two of the 18 ultra-Orthodox members of the Knesset, Israel's parliament, supported the bill to dissolve.

Most agreed to vote against the bill after Foreign Affairs and Defence Committee Chairman Yuli Edelstein said he and the ultra-Orthodox parties had reached an understanding on the basis of a new draft law, which they will continue discussing over the coming week.

DEATH TOLL IN SOUTH AFRICA FLOODS RISES TO 57

he death toll in floods in one of South Africa's poorest provinces rose to 57 on Thursday as a top official said rescue attempts had been "paralysed" by a lack of resources.

Rescue teams are still working through debris and floodwater to find missing people after heavy rain caused a river to burst its banks in the predawn hours of Tuesday. Floods hit the nearby town of Mthatha and surrounding areas, sweeping away victims along with parts of their houses and cars.

Oscar Mabuyane, the premier of Eastern Cape province, said the floods struck while many people were asleep. The water was 3-4 metres high when it flowed out of a river and into nearby communities,

tion," Mabuyane told state TV broadcaster SABC. "It happened at the wrong time."

Mabuyane said local authorities struggled to launch an effective rescue effort as the disaster happened in what he described as a region lacking resources.

He said the largely rural Eastern Cape province in southeastern South Africa, which is home to around 7.2 million people, only has one rescue helicopter. It came to Mthatha from the city of Gqeberha, more than 500 km away.

He also said the region does not have any specialist rescue divers or K-9 dog units, meaning they had to be called in from elsewhere to help with the search. "When things like this happen, we are always found wanting," said Mabuyane. "We are paralysed." People were

More than 20 people detained on first night of curfew in downtown LA

officials previously said they believed people were still missing but did not give an exact number. There was no immediate update on Thursday whether authorities believed all those who were not accounted for had been found.

The death toll rose to 57, according to Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs Minister Velenkosini Hlabisa, who led a national government delegation to the province to visit the scene.

"This is a real disaster and a catastrophe when we have so many people dying, Hlabisa said. He added that part of the problem was that many people in the area were living on a flood plain close to

The missing had included four high school students who were swept away when their bus was caught up in the floods on its way to school early Tuesday morning. Authorities did not immediately say if those four children were among the latest bodies retrieved.

Six students who were on the bus had already been confirmed dead, along with the driver and another adult. Three other students were rescued after clinging onto trees and calling out for help, according to the provincial government.

The floods hit the province after an extreme cold front brought heavy rain, strong winds and snow to parts of eastern and southern South Africa. The floods centred on Mthatha and its surrounding district, which is around 430 km south of the east coast city of Durban. Forecasters had warned about the damaging weather last week.

Officials said at least 58 schools and 20 hospitals in the

Eastern Cape were damaged while hundreds of families were left homeless after their houses were submerged or washed away. Critical infrastructure including roads and bridges was also badly damaged, Mabuyane said.

South African President Cyril Ramaphosa said that he would travel to the Eastern Cape on Friday "to see exactly how our people are suffering there and see how we can console the families".

Ramaphosa announced earlier in the week that he had activated the National Disaster Management Centre to help local authorities in the Eastern Cape.

A National Guard troops deployed to the Los Angeles protests have been trained to accompany agents on immigration operations, the commander in charge said on Wednesday. And while some troops have already gone on such missions, he said it is too early to say if that will continue even after the protests die down.

Maj Gen Scott Sherman, speaking in an interview with The Associated Press and ABC, also warned that he expects the protest situation will escalate. "We are expecting a ramp up," he said, noting that protests across the nation are being planned and discussed now. "I'm focused right here in LA, what's going on right here. But you know, I think we're very concerned."

Sherman, commander of Task Force 51 that is overseeing the more than 4,000 Guard troops and 700 Marines deployed, initially said that National Guard troops had already temporarily detained some civilians. He later said he was incorrect, and that he had based his comments on photos and footage he had seen that turned out to not be a representation of Guard members in Los Angeles.

He said that as of Wednesday, none of the troops has detained a protester. But he said they have gone through days of training and are prepared to do so if

India slips to 131st in Global Gender Gap Index

ndia has ranked 131 out of 148 countries in the World Economic Forum's Global Gender Gap Report 2025, slipping two places from its position last year. With a parity score of just 64.1 per cent, India is among the lowest-ranked countries in South Asia, according to the report released on Thursday. India ranked 129 last year

out of 146 countries. "In 2025, India ranks 131st, with an overall gender parity score of 64.4 per cent. Compared to the 2024 edition, India sees a relative drop in rank due to the performance of other economies," it said.

The Global Gender Gap Index measures gender parity across four key dimensions: Economic Participation and Opportunity, Educational Attainment, Health and

Empowerment.

The Indian economy's overall performance improved in absolute terms by +0.3 points.

"One of the dimensions where India increases parity is in Economic Participation and Opportunity, where its score improves by +.9 percentage points to 40.7 per cent. While most indicator values remain the same, parity in estimated earned income rises from 28.6 per cent to 29.9 per cent, positively impacting the subindex score," the report said.

Scores in labour force participation rate remained the same (45.9 per cent) as last year - India's highest achieved to date.

In educational attainment, the report said, India scored 97.1 per cent, reflecting positive shifts in female shares for literacy and tertiary education enrolment, which resulted in positive score improvements



for the subindex as a whole.

"India also records higher parity in health and survival, driven by improved scores in sex ratio at birth and in healthy life expectancy," it said. However, similar to other countries, parity in healthy life expectancy is obtained despite an overall reduction in the life expectancy of men and women, the report said.

"Where India records a slight drop in parity (-0.6 points) since the last edition is

Nepal ranked 125, Sri Lanka 130, Bhutan 119, Maldives 138 and Pakistan ranked at the bottom among all countries at 148. "In 2025, Southern Asia ranks 7th, with a gender parity score of 64.6 per cent. Of the seven economies that make up the regional block, only Bangladesh (24th, 77.5 per cent) places in the top 50," the report said.

In Economic Participation and Opportunity, the region scores 40.6 per cent. Over time, Southern Asia has increased its parity score for economic representation for senior workers (+9.1 percentage points) and for professionand technical workers (+17.2 percentage points).

World shares mixed as markets shrug at latest China-US trade deal

7 orld shares were trading mixed early Thursday after Wall Street's rally stalled, as investors appeared not to react much to the results of the latest round of China-US trade talks. Germany's DAX lost 0.7 per cent to 23,787.77 and the CAC 40 in Paris slipped 0.4 per cent to 7,744.41.

Britain's FTSE 100 was nearly unchanged at 8,863.07.

The futures for the S&P 500 and the Dow Jones Industrial Average were down 0.3 per cent.

In Asian trading, Japan's Nikkei 225 lost 0.5 per cent to 38,216.06. Hong Kong's Hang Seng sank 0.5 per cent to 24,234.80, while the Shanghai Composite index edged 0.1 per cent lower to 3,404.66.

In South Korea, the Kospi gained 0.9 per cent to 2,933.44, while Australia's S&P/ASX 200 edged 0.1 per cent higher to 8,604.50. Taiwan's Taiex lost 0.8 per cent.

On Wednesday, the S&P 500 fell 0.3 per cent to 6,022.24 for its first loss in four days. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was virtually unchanged at 42,865.77 after edging down by 1 point. The Nasdaq composite slipped 0.5 per cent to 3,400.30.

Several Big Tech stocks led the way lower, and a 1.9 per cent drop for Apple was the heaviest weight on the market. It's been listless this week after unveiling several modest upcoming changes to the software that runs its devices.

The action was stronger in the bond market, where Treasury yields eased after a report suggested President Donald Trump's tariffs are not pushing inflation much higher, at least not yet. Without them, the fear is that Trump's high tariffs could drive the economy into a recession while pushing inflation higher. The S&P 500 is now sitting 2 per

cent below its record. Tesla swung between gains and losses before finishing with a rise of 0.1 per cent to continue its shaky run. Addressing non-tariff barriers key for India, EU trade pact: Goyal

inding solutions to address non-tariff barriers would be important for the proposed free trade agreement (FTA) between India and the European Union (EU) and both sides are actively working on resolving these issues, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said on Thursday. He said the two sides are "pretty" close to finalising the talks for the proposed free trade pact.

"Significant progress has been made. More than half the chapters are ready. In terms of content, I would say we are almost 90 per cent ready for market access. The important issues to be addressed are non-tariff barriers and how we will make it smoother, easier, and better to do business between the EU and India," Goyal told reporters here.

He added that both India and the EU are in active discussions to find solutions to make business smooth for companies of both sides.

"Unless countries recognise that over regulation and barriers to trade will be met with reciprocal action, everybody suffers. We are committed to deregulation, to finding solutions to the high cost of regulation, the non-tariff barriers that these regulations cause and the impediments to free trade. I am quite hopeful that we will find very robust solutions to this problem," the minister said.

India's exports are far below potential as they face NTBs in regions, including the EU, the US, China, Japan and Korea.

According to think tank GTRI, the EU has set MRL (minimum residual limit) for tricyclazole, a fungicide in rice, to 0.01 mg per kg as against the ten times higher limit earlier.

Stockholm: India's goods and services exports during 2025-26 are expected to cross \$900 billion despite the global economic uncertainties, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal has said.

Despite uncertainties due to the Russia-Ukraine conflict, Israel-Hamas war and the Red Sea crisis, the country's overall exports touched an all-time high of \$825 billion in 2024-25 against \$778 billion in 2023-24. "We have crossed \$825 billion exports last year, we are surely to cross \$900 billion this year in all this global turmoil," he has said here while addressing the Indian business delegation last night.

The EU market accounts for about 17 per cent of Indias total exports, while the EU's exports to India make up 9 per cent of its total exports.

'No MDR will be charged on UPI transactions'

he Finance Ministry has said no Merchant Discount Rate (MDR) will be levied on transactions through Unified Payments Interface platforms. "Speculation and claims that the MDR will be charged on UPI transactions are completely false, baseless, and misleading," the ministry said in a post on X on Wednesday.

"Such baseless and sensation-creating speculations cause needless uncertainty, fear and suspicion among our citizens. The Government remains fully committed to promoting digital payments via UPI," it said. MDR is the cost paid by a merchant to a bank for accepting payment from their customers via digital means. The merchant discount rate is expressed in percentage of the transaction amount.

The ministry's clarification came following some reports that the government is planning to impose MDR on largeticket UPI transactions.

Meanwhile, transactions through UPI touched a record high of ₹25.14 lakh crore in May, recording a growth of 5 per cent over the preceding month, according to data released by the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI). The UPI transactions value was ₹23.94 lakh crore in April. In terms of volume, 1,867.7 crore transactions were done in May against 1,789.3 crore in the previous month.

xpressing grave concern over steep increase in Excise Duty on Indian Made Foreign Liquor (IMFL) by up to 50 per cent by the Maharashtra Government, the Confederation of Indian Alcoholic Beverage Companies (CIABC) has urged the State Government to rethink and reconsider such a huge hike as it could trigger serious consequences.

The CIABC has urged the State Government to immediately hold deliberations with all stakeholders "to arrive at a balanced, data-driven, and sustainable course of action that protects both revenue interests and the long-term viability of the IMFL sector in Maharashtra".

Stating that the CIABC has

already written to the

ing to start a consultative process with all stakeholders before releasing any final gazette notification, Anant S Iyer, Director General of the apex body of the Indian Alcoholic Beverage Industry, underlined that this steep hike in excise is projected to push Maximum Retail Prices (MRPs) up by as much as 85 per cent, a step that could severely disrupt the market, erode the competitiveness of national brands, and jeopardise the availability of legitimate alcoholic beverages in Maharashtra.

"Such an unprecedented escalation in duties poses a serious deterrence to consumer access of established and reputed brands, compelling a shift toward lowercategory products. This poses a serious threat to the stability of the IMFL industry in the State such a move will have a

far-reaching adverse impact,"

CIABC urges Maharashtra Government

Maharashtra Government urg-Iyer said in a statement. Pointing out that steep hike in excise duty will lead a steep and abrupt increase in MRPs (maximum retail price), Iyer said it will destabilise consumer accessibility and purchasing power, particularly within the mass-market segment which caters to the common man. This will lead to a significant drop in legal sales volumes, overlooking the interest of industry and its substantial investment in the state. It will also endanger the employment of people engaged in the entire value

chain from farm to consumer. Iver warned that higher MRPs often create a vacuum filled by illegal operators. Past experiences show that pricing arbitrage fosters regional imbalances, encouraging the spread of illicit and unsafe

liquor and counterfeits of popular brands-posing a major public health risk and leading

to further revenue leakage. Noting that this move will also result in increased stock dumping from neighbouring states, the CIABC DG said Maharashtra shares borders with states that are porous. These states have similar brands which have lower MRPs for IMFL. Any additional price escalation will trigger large-scale dumping (exfiltration) from these states, resulting in illicit inflows that damage legitimate trade and erode the State's tax base.

Maharashtra has always ensured minimal impact of such occurrences by ensuring competitive pricing vide neighbouring states till now.

The IMFL industry contributes approximately 60 percent of the total Excise Revenue

of the State. Furthermore, the Excise Duty collected from a single case of IMFL is equivalent to that from four cases of beer, underscoring the critical importance of this category. Duty increase on IMFL, without corresponding changes for a category such as beer will create an uneven playing field and distort category dynamics leading to possible adverse impact on revenue.

CIABC has highlighted to the Maharashtra government that while the intent behind the proposed hike may be to enhance revenue collections by ₹14,000 crore, the actual outcome may be contrary- driven by declining sales, rising illicit trade, and border leakages. The long-term impact could be deeply detrimental, not only for industry and employment, but also for public safety and overall State revenues.

FROM VEDIC TIMES TO MODERN CHALLENGES

This book offers a thorough examination of India's Parliament, exploring its history, functions and the urgent need for reform, says GYANESHWAR DAYAL

he Indian Parliament — Samvidhan Sadan to Sansad **Bhawan** — is the first and muchawaited book after the construction of the new Parliament building. Published by LexisNexis, the book sets out the great many procedural and policy changes in the Indian parliamentary landscape, apart from showcasing the hoary republican heritage of India and the powers, functions, and procedures of the Indian Parliament. A compendium of intimately connected and allied scholarly essays, it sets out the historical background of the introduction of a separate Rail Budget in 1925 and its eventual merger with the Annual Budget in 2017 and the presentation of a single consolidated Budget to Parliament in terms of Article 112 of the Constitution.

The book comprises full-fledged chapters on the great republican heritage of India beginning from the Vedic times; the evolution, framing, and the working of the Constitution of India; powers and functions of Parliament; legislative and budgetary processes; devices of accountability including Questions; Committee system and how it works; legislature-judiciary interface; role of political parties and opposition in a democracy; elections and electoral systems obtaining in the world and their relative merits and demerits; role of C&AG as supreme audit institution of the country; democratic disquiet and the future of democracy and allied aspects of parliamentary democracy not to be found in a single


book elsewhere. The chief merit of the book is that it's not only a fine blend of constitutional pre-

Another remarkable aspect of the book is that the author captures in his lucid, highly readable text, traversing history, procedure, precedents, methods, and even anecdotal accounts, giving the reader an excel-lent up-to-date reference manual on what Parliament stands for, and how it functions. 



some quality bowlers that are unavailable, but we have a nice, varied bowling attack with Chris Woakes, Sam Cook, Brydon Carse, Jamie Overton, Josh Tongue for the high-pace element," the former New Zealand skipper said.

"We have Shoaib Bashir, who is growing in Test cricket every day. We know we are going to be tested against India, and they will arrive prepared," he added.

India begin a new era after Test retirements of veterans Virat Kohli, Rohit Sharma, and R Ashwin. The team will be led by Shubman and features Sai Sudharsan and Yashasvi Jaiswal. England all-rounder Jacob Bathel has been recalled and McCullum was all praise for the 21-year-old.

Azteca Stadium to feature hybrid field for 2026 World Cup

hybrid field, updated locker rooms, elevators and hospitality zones are among the new features of Azteca Stadium for the 2026 World Cup. Ollamani, the sports entertainment company that owns the stadium, also confirmed Wednesday that Azteca will reopen March 26, which will be 75 days before the start of the World Cup as Mexico City Mayor Clara Brugada announced recently.

"The centerpiece of the stadium's renovation is the people who visit it. Our main objective is to substantially improve their experience in every way," stadium director Felix Aguirre said in a statement.

The iconic venue closed last May for renovations ahead of next year's 48team competition hosted by Mexico, the United States and Canada. The 83,000seat Azteca, which recently was renamed, will host five games including the tournament opener. It also hosted the first matches in the 1970 and 1986 World Cups.

Ollamani, which is affiliated with Grupo Televisa, Mexico's largest television network, also said the stadium will have bigger capacity, but did not specify how many extra seats it will have.

It will be the second time that Azteca has a hybrid pitch - one was installed in 2018 but returned to natural grass a year later. The poor field conditions in November 2018 forced a last-minute change of venue for an NFL game between the Kansas City Chiefs and the Los Angeles Rams. "The pitch, being subjected to intensive use, will have a new ventilation and suction system, thereby achieving better recovery, stability and resistance," Ollamani said in a statement.

The new locker rooms will be located at the center of the stadium under the luxury boxes and with a tunnel leading to the pitch. Before, they were located in the north and south part of it. "The project includes new facilities in

the competition areas, improving the experience of the player, fans and media in line with the most modern stadiums in the world," the company said.

The plan includes installing large LED screens inside and outside the stadium. Before the renovations, the stadium had just two big screens that were installed in 2015.

Ollamani did not provided specific details about elevators or escalators. In the past, the only way to move between the lower and upper sections was using an old ramp. The hospitality zones were also a necessity. The old stadium had a small concession area outside the venue, but inside there were no food courts and the fans were forced to buy from the vendors roaming the seating area.

Among other renovations, the stadium owner also announced a new press box area, improved restrooms, a 200-unit CCTV surveillance system and a new sound system. Originally, a major renovation was planned including a shopping center and hotel, but residents of Santa Úrsula, a popular neighborhood located south of the capital, opposed them.

US Open prize money

For the first time since 2021, the US Open is not increasing its prize money. It will be \$21.5 million for the second straight year, with \$4.3 million going to the winner. It remains the biggest purse of the four majors. The Masters was \$21 million this year, while the PGA Championship was at \$19 million. The British Open hasn't announced its total purse for next month at Royal Portrush. It was at \$17 million last year.

The US Open purse was \$12.5 million in 2020 and 2021 before making a big leap to \$17.5 million in 2022 at Brookline.

"I feel comfortable that we've been a leader in moving fast and bigger," USGA CEO Mike Whan said Wednesday.

The Players Championship has a \$25 million purse. The USGA and R& A get the bulk of their revenue from their Opens. They also use that money to invest back in the game, including the Women's Opens and amateur events such as the Walker Cup and

Poland coach resigns after dispute with Lewandowski

Football Association. Probierz stripped Barcelona striker Lewandowski of his position as team captain on the eve of a

qualifier Cup against Finland earlier this week, and named Inter Milan midfielder Piotr Zielinski as the new captain.

Lewandowski reacted by saying he would no longer play for the national team as long as Probierz remains head coach. Poland went on to suffer an embarrassing 2-1 defeat to Finland, to put its qualifications hopes into jeopardy.

The 36-year-old Lewandowski, who has played a record 158 games for his

country and is the leading scorer with 85 goals, is arguably the most outstanding player in the history of Polish soccer.

Lewandowski pulled out of last Friday's friendly over Moldova, citing tiredness from a La Liga title-winning season with Barcelona. Probierz, who took over in September 2023 after the disappointing tenure of Fernando Santos, managed to secure qualification for the 2024 European Championship but has since struggled.
